


- The black candle in the middle gets lit first and it means unity.

- The sixth candle means creativity and it is red.
- The seventh and last candle is green and it represents faith.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.


- Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia.

- Dr. King skipped his senior year of high school and started college when he was only 15 years old.




- In the early 1950s, Dr. King met Coretta and they married in 1953.
