



## Literacy Tools

Students can use a variety of literacy tools to annotate directly on the pages of books within the myON library.

To use the tools, open a book and click on the tools icon. Students then have access to all of their literacy tools.





Use the drawing tool to add drawings or shapes directly onto the text, illustrations or photos on a page. Use the built in eraser to remove any drawings or brush strokes.





Use sticky notes to take notes while reading, ask questions for further research, respond to reading and keep track of important information learned. Multiple sticky notes can be added on a page.



Use one of the shape options to draw lines, circles, boxes or arrows around important information on a page. Use the built in eraser if you make a mistake or want to change the shape to a different color.



All annotations automatically save within books. Students can click the trash icon to see choices for which annotations they wish to delete.



The quizzes are optional based on faculty preferences and can be turned on or off.




